MINUTES

The Clay County Board of Commissioners met in regular session with the following Commissioners present: Frank Gross, Jim Haney, Kevin Campbell, Jenny Mongeau, and Grant Weyland. Others present or joining remotely: County Attorney Brian Melton, County Administrator Stephen Larson, and Senior Administrative Assistant Colleen Eck.

CALL TO ORDER

Chair Gross called the meeting to order.

APPROVAL OF AGENDA

On motion by Commissioner Mongeau, seconded by Commissioner Campbell, and unanimously carried, the Board approved the agenda with one addition: Budget impacts regarding Covid-19.

2019 PERFORMANCE CREDIT REPORT – COUNTY FEEDLOT OFFICER

By consent, the Board approved the County Feedlot Officer's Annual Report for 2019.

REQUESTS FOR TAX ABATEMENTS DUE TO CLERICAL ERRORS

By consent, the Board approved tax abatements for two properties in the City of Glyndon for exemptions due to the use/ownership of the properties.

CITIZENS TO BE HEARD

During this pandemic, citizens continue to have the opportunity to share feedback at board meetings via website link. Mr. Larson noted there have been no requests submitted for this meeting.

APPROVAL OF PAYMENT OF BILLS AND VOUCHERS

On motion by Commissioner Campbell, seconded by Commissioner Haney, and unanimously carried, the Board approved payment for bills and vouchers totaling \$759,418 from 83 vendors. From that total, 60 warrants issued were under \$2,000 (\$32,532) and the following 23 were over \$2,000:

APPROVAL OF MINUTES FROM APRIL 21, 2020

On motion by Commissioner Haney, seconded by Commissioner Grant, and unanimously carried, the Board approved the minutes from April 21, 2020.

ANNUAL REPORT FOR ADULT MENTAL HEALTH LOCAL ADVISORY COUNCIL

Alison Wolbeck, Co-Chair for Clay County Adult Mental Health Local Advisory Council, was present with an annual report from the advisory council. The report primarily focuses on addressing the needs of adults with mental illness in the County. She thanked the Board for their continued financial support. In the past year they expended funds on a prize wheel and prizes for a greater understanding of mental health. They were also able to provide stipends for participation in community mental health projects. The Covid-19 pandemic has added stressors on individuals and housing expenses have continued to increase. They recommend continued support to maintain low rental housing and consistent funding for Social Services to help maintain stable housing. The current membership list for the Local Advisory Council for Adult Mental Health needs to be approved by the Board. The membership has not changed since last year.

On motion by Commissioner Weyland, seconded by Commissioner Campbell, and unanimously approved, the Board approved the Local Advisory Council for Adult Mental Health membership list.

ANNUAL REPORT FOR CHILDREN'S MENTAL HEALTH LOCAL ADVISORY COUNCIL AND PROCLAMATION FOR MENTAL HEALTH MONTH

Carolyn Strnad, Co-Chair of Children's Mental Health Local Advisory Council (LAC), addressed the Board. She reviewed their projects from the last year including a game they developed with emoji faces that has been well-received. Some of the events they participate in have been cancelled due to the Corona virus. Feedback on the parent surveys shows an increase in awareness of the services available to them regarding mental health. Results from a professional survey include transportation barriers and parent's lack of knowledge on accessing services. Ms. Strnad noted they have made some progress in getting gas cards, free bus passes, and volunteer drivers, but more volunteer drivers are still needed. They also get some donations for Uber rides. When a case manager brings a child to an appointment, they are not allowed to transport the parent. Medical Assistance and the PMAP Plan set that rule.

Ms. Strnad stated the program's successes are due in part to Social Services Director Rhonda Porter for working with a pilot project and being involved in the LAC. Funds have enabled school-based mental health services to continue in all the County's public schools. Commissioner Haney is part of the LAC group that meets every month. She thanked Commissioner Haney, the other Commissioners, and Ms. Porter and Ms. Thordal from Social Services for being a part of the LAC. She encouraged everyone to wear green on Thursday in support of children's mental health.

The Mental Health Month Proclamation was read by Ms. Strnad.

On motion by Commissioner Campbell, seconded by Commissioner Weyland, and unanimously carried the Board proclaimed May as Mental Health Month and specifically May 7th as Children's Mental Health Day in Clay County.

COVID-19 UPDATE

Public Health Director Kathy McKay provided handouts with the current numbers of positive COVID-19 cases in Minnesota and Clay County. MN has had 7,234 cases and 428 deaths and Clay County 190 cases and 13 deaths. More asymptomatic cases are showing up. Local testing is being done by Sanford and Essentia. Clay County residents can also be tested at those facilities. Positive cases are tracked in the County and State in which the individual resides. The first round of testing was done at the Fargo Dome and was open for residents on both sides of the river. An individual could go to the Fargo Dome and see if they fit the criteria to be tested. A second round of testing was started there again on Monday but ended early when the lab got backlogged.

The Commissioners noted frustration and concern that Clay County residents have not been informed that they can go to testing sites in Fargo. Commissioner Mongeau commented that Clay County is a hotspot and it is vital to have individuals tested who are going into congregate living facilities and long-term care facilities. Ms. McKay stated that staff in those facilities and others with highest risk criteria are receiving 90-minute tests and getting notified the same day. For contact tracing, an individual has to have experience in public health or epidemiology. Ms. McKay has a list of who could participate in local contact tracing; however, the State has been able to keep up with contact tracing thus far. She continues to convey the gaps in communication and frustrations regarding testing for Clay County residents to the MN Department of Health. Clay County Public Health received another \$25,000 in grant dollars to be used for isolating homeless and the most vulnerable population. The Public Health Department awaits a vaccine to be developed. If 70% of the population gets vaccinated the outlook would be favorable. The health care facilities are also hoping to have antibody blood tests for COVID in the near futures. The tests would show how an individual's immune system has responded to the virus.

The next local media conference is at 11:00 a.m. tomorrow and the Mayor of Moorhead is conducting a virtual town hall meeting at 8:00 p.m. today.

APPROVAL OF YEARLY SUPPLY BIDS

County Engineer David Overbo and Assistant Engineer Justin Sorum were present for the requests from the Highway Department. They handed out the 2020 bid tabs for corrugated metal culverts, bituminous mixture, rental of construction equipment and furnishing crushed gravel. They recommended approval of all bids for corrugated metal culverts, bituminous mixture, and rental of construction equipment as presented. For gravel bids, they recommended the low bids from Turner Sand and Gravel for Townships 1-12 and 16-30; and Aggregate Industries for Townships 13-15. The gravel bids were submitted in tonnage rather than cubic yards this year. A 42-cent royalty is used for material from the County pit to keep it comparable. Mr. Overbo will track the volumes coming out of the County pit.

Commissioner Mongeau noted appreciation of the plan to get more gravel on the roads this year.

On motion by Commissioner Campbell, seconded by Commissioner Weyland, and unanimously carried, the Board approved the 2020 bids for corrugated metal culverts, bituminous mixture, and rental of construction equipment as submitted. *See Attachment A.*

On motion by Commissioner Campbell, seconded by Commissioner Haney, and unanimously carried, the Board approved the low gravel bids from Turner Sand and Gravel for Townships 1-12 and 16-30; and Aggregate Industries for Townships 13-15. *See Attachment B.*

BID OPENING FOR SIX BRIDGE REPLACEMENTS

Mr. Overbo and Mr. Sorum brought forth seven bids for a combined project that ties replacement of six bridges together. This is a federally funded project with some dollars also coming out of the bridge bond funds and some County funds. The bridges are on County Roads 68, 93, CSAH 21 and three on CR 100. There is one addendum for Co Rd. 21 and a 5% bid bond requirement. The Engineer’s estimate for the project is \$948,941.77. The following bids were opened and entered into the record:

On motion by Commissioner Campbell, seconded by Commissioner Mongeau, and unanimously carried, the Board approved the low bid from Gladen Construction, Inc. for \$875,624.75, contingent on no errors in the bid and approval of Civil Rights Contract Clearance from the MnDOT office.

ADDITION: BUDGET IMPACTS REGARDING COVID-19

County Administrator Stephen Larson stated there have been some challenges and expected loss in sales tax with the COVID shutdowns. The County will have a better idea in June of the sales tax revenues. The Recorder’s Office and Motor Vehicle Department have both lost revenues while being closed for several weeks. Social Services and Public Health have been able to retain their reimbursements. There has also been some savings in staff not traveling to attend conferences and workshops. He will ask for the managers’ input regarding budget impacts in their departments at the next management meetings from the departments. Commissioner Campbell asked to see the potential lost revenue and ideas on how the County would make up for it.


COMMITTEE REPORTS/COUNTY ADMINISTRATOR UPDATE/DISCUSSIONS

Many of the following committee reports are from meetings that took place remotely.


- Commissioner Campbell attended a Correctional Facility and Juvenile Center construction wrap-up meeting.

She noted that since last October 469 inmates have received services offered by Lakeland Mental Health staff in the Clay County Correctional Facility.

- Commissioner Haney participated in the COVID-19 FM Media Conference.
- Commissioner Gross attended a Personnel Issues Committee meeting.
- Stephen Larson attended meetings for Correctional Facility and Juvenile Center construction wrap-up; Personnel Issues Committee; Solid Waste MOU; Court Administration re: trials; a department head evaluation; County Management; parking for fleet vehicles on campus; shared maintenance issues; virtual meeting with locals; County Attorney consult; and water issues in the tunnel. He noted that spring road restrictions were removed yesterday for areas south of Hwy 10, and on Friday for areas north of Hwy 10.
